

This data is helpful for indentifying longer term economic trends, as well as the impact of events such as COVID within the region.


# Fraser Coast spending consistent with national trends

Local vs. National Expenditure




# Fraser Coast Spend – Categories Return to pre-covid cycles





15.62% increase vs. Feb 2020


Feb 2021 visitor spend in Fraser Coast was \$23.9 million18.66% increase vs. Feb 2020
