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the process in which an economy grows or changes and becomes more advanced, especially when both economic and social conditions are improved.

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the sustained, concerted actions of policy makers and communities that promote the standard of living and economic health of a specific area.



Population



Estimated at **120,685 in 2024** up 2.3% from 2023

Growth averaged **2.4% per annum** in the 4 years since pandemic, above QLD average of 2%

- Hervey Bay 27th largest community in Australia – av 2.1% growth per annum.
- Maryborough 54th largest community in Australia av 0.9% growth per annum.
- Together approaching top 20 urban areas in Australia.
- Fraser Coast 12th largest local government in Queensland.


- Residents aged 64yrs and over expected to increase by 20,000 by 2046.

Nearly 1000 houses in lifestyle villages already completed with over 1,500 more on the way and already approved.












Tourism Sector



Aviation



The introduction of Jetstar Melbourne flights has added to the significant increase in passenger numbers

Aviation

Hervey Bay Airport is currently serviced by:

- ✓ Jetstar from Sydney and Melbourne
- ✓ QantasLink from Brisbane
- ✓ Lady Elliot Island
- ✓ Medical Flights RFDS and Lifeline

Over the past 12 months passenger numbers have increased by an average 30% compared to the same period last year. January passenger numbers exceed 21,000.





Workforce and Skills

- Unemployment rate of 5.4% in December Quarter 2024.
- 97% of jobs available inside the region (32,438) are filled by residents.
- The region has significantly lower proportion of professionals and managers and a higher representation of labourers, and community and personal service workers compared to similar regions.
















Nikenbah / Dundowran Growth Investigation Areas




- \$5m land sale across the road from Seafront Oval
